

# NANAIMO CORRECTIONAL CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

# Project Background

The replacement of the Nanaimo Correctional Centre (NCC) is an opportunity to build new facilities to enhance safety, security, functionality, and cultural spaces to continue successful programs for rehabilitation in a healing context.

With a campus like-style configuration to maximize use of the natural surroundings and views of Brannen Lake, the vision for the project is for residents to feel as though they are connected to the outdoors and to enjoy water views, in a natural setting.

The proposed design includes 11 new buildings replacing the former correctional centre at 3945 Biggs Rd. The phased project approach allows the existing facility to operate while the new buildings are being constructed. Construction is currently ongoing and scheduled to complete mid-2024.

The project is being designed and constructed through partnerships led by Stuart Olson.

## Facility and Architect Designs

Originally built as a reform school in 1953, NCC is one of two provincial correctional centres housing only sentenced, open and medium classified individuals who do not require higher levels of supervision. The new centre will build on the well-established programming, and be designed to:

- Enhance culturally responsive programming and spaces through collaboration with the Snuneymuxw and Snaw'Naw'As First Nations;
- Incorporate Coast Salish architectural traditions into the building designs;
- Maintain the 190-room capacity of the current centre and add a new 12-room unit for short-term custody for women from Vancouver Island; this will be Vancouver Island's first provincial custody unit for women, adding separate capacity for accommodating women who require short-term custody while on remand or awaiting transfer to serve a sentence;
- Offer modernized spaces for educational, vocational, certified trades and rehabilitative programming, plus specialized areas for food services, health care and working with those with complex mental health and other needs;
- Provide enhanced programming for recovery and treatment of inmates. For example, The
  Guthrie House Therapeutic Community (GTC) accepts sentenced men from correctional
  centres throughout BC. The 12-year-old substance treatment program combines work,
  treatment, counselling, and round-the-clock behavioural modelling to address the root causes
  of addiction, teach fundamental life skills and prepare residents to live crime free upon release.
  A pilot study found that individuals who have gone through GTC are 33% less likely to reoffend.

# Indigenous Community Involvement

The project construction team and the project Owner (Province of BC) have been working with both Snuneymuxw and Snaw'Naw'As First Nations to support the design, construction, and future operations of the new NCC. There are several opportunities for community involvement:

### Design/Construction of Indigenous Infrastructure

The correctional centre's focus on incorporation of culturally responsive programming and spaces throughout the campus has led to several design workshops with the Snuneymuxw and Snaw'Naw'As First Nations to understand the design of cultural spaces and key architecture elements that would be beneficial to residents and users. Ongoing workshops with knowledge keepers have been most informative in providing insight and suggestions.

#### <u>Artwork</u>

The design team is currently focused on creating and reserving spaces for indigenous artwork in prominent areas within the campus. Along with the Snuneymuxw and Snaw'Naw'As First Nations, these opportunities are being defined as part of ongoing workshops. Once defined, requests will be opened to artists for submissions and creation.



# **Employment**

Employment Opportunities include 650 direct jobs and 275 indirect jobs during the construction phase. Including but not limited to all types and fields of skilled trades, equipment operators, safety personnel, and skilled labourers. Stuart Olson is working with Snuneymuxw and Snaw'Naw'As employment coordinators to seek interested workers for a variety of positions. We welcome all applicants that are interested.

#### Subcontract / Joint Venture Opportunities
