With so much progress being made over the last few months, I wanted to take the time to share an updated list of our beloved shared community spaces. Our intention is to foster a built environment that supports our way of being and responds to community needs.

- **Snuneymuxw Kitchen:** Space to host events that breathe life into our culture, such as family gatherings, funerals, and brushings.
- **Snuneymuxw Youth Centre:** Formerly known as the Snuneymuxw Recreation and Wellness Centre/Gym/MUB, the Snuneymuxw Youth Centre is now a dedicated, safe and inclusive youth space with integrated supports for our young people. There will still be times for all members to access the weight room and gymnasium, please stay tuned.
- **Snuneymuxw Learning Academy (SLA):** Snuneymuxw Learning Academy (formerly known as Woodbank) is also home to our Snuneymuxw Traditional Medicines Clinic, because to learn is to heal and to heal is to learn. SLA programming includes computer and employment training courses, hul'q'umi'num' language courses and Indigenous medicines classes.
- Snuneymuxw Learning Academy Centre Street Classroom: The SLA satellite classroom located on Centre Street is for students under the age of 19, who are pursuing their high school graduation requirements. Tutoring also available in this space.
- Snuneymuxw Traditional Medicines Clinic: The Snuneymuxw Traditional Medicines Clinic continues a longstanding relationship with the Chinese community. We recognize the beautiful connection between Snuneymuxw Ancestral wellness knowledge and other traditional practices. We hope you will continue this tradition of care, in benefit of yourself and your loved ones.
- Qwam Qwum Stuwixwulh School (QQS): Elementary school with curriculum that
 prioritizes traditional Snuneymuxw teachings, supported by contemporary and ancestral
 technology. After school programing is now available at QQS for elementary school-aged
 students. We strive to support all aspects of education, going beyond intellect alone.







Our counsellors at SFN hulit lelum have completed trauma-informed, master's level university education and are certified counsellors.

Our counsellors are available Monday to Friday to support Snuneymuxw members.

Some of the areas that our counsellors may be able to help with include, but are not limited to:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Grief & Loss
- Loss of relationships (friends, partners)
- Coping with anger
- Dealing with difficult emotions
- Coping skills / emotional regulation
- Self-esteem / self-worth
- Communication
- Creating healthy boundaries
- Coping with racism and discrimination
- Coping with impact of residential school and day school
- Concerns about your own, or someone else's substance use

If our counsellors determine that you may be better supported by another service provider (for example, someone who specializes in a particular area) they can help you navigate other options.
