
Snuneymuxw is a vibrant First Nation of the Coast Salish People, located in the centre of Coast Salish territory on the eastern coast of Vancouver Island, the Gulf Islands, the Fraser River, Burrard Inlet and the Howe Sound. Snuneymuxw territory encompasses one of the most productive and resource-rich areas at the heart of the Salish Sea. On December 23, 1854, the Crown entered the Sarlequun Snuneymuxw Treaty of 1854, constituting solemn promises and obligations to forever and always protect Snuneymuxw villages, enclosed fields and the right to hunt and fish.

# CHAMPIONS OF RECLAMATION JUSTICE

Snuneymuxw continues to be at the forefront of reconciliation justice. From the success of the White and Bob case in the 1960s to the Nation's most recent return of te'tuxwtun reserve lands in 2025, we continue to restore our way of being.

In 2025, almost 80 hectares of federal land in Nanaimo, B.C., were added to our reserve lands. The property, formerly known as Camp Nanaimo, was once the site of the Nanaimo Indian Hospital and was also used by the Department of National Defense. It makes up part of te'tuxwtun [Mount Benson].

With this addition, Snuneymuxw now has the largest urban reserve in the province.





#### **TIMELINE**

Snuneyxw Gas Bar Ground Breaking B.C. Land Transfer Agreement, establishing a multi-site land return framework which includes the te'tuxwtun (Mount Benson) land returns. Inter-tribal protocols & collaborations (Vancouver Island and Fraser River). Ongoing Nation-to-Nation collaboration through forums and structures such as the Naut'sa mawt Tribal Council, to advance Nanaimo Port Authority Relationship Agreement, shared priorities and responsibilities across Island establishing a partnership framework and Lower Fraser communities. grounded in Snuneymuxw treaty rights and sustainable development. Marriott Nanaimo Ground Breaking Vancouver Island Ferry Company partnership agreement, in recognition of Snuneymuxw treaty rights and regarding Hullo Ferries. Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (SFN, BC and Canada), recognizing and advancing implementation of the Sarleguun Snuneymuxw Treaty of 1854. BC Housing MOU, advancing housing for Snuneymuxw First Nation members on and off-Reserve. Seacliff partnership agreement advancing the development of the Sandstone lands on kwa'luxw Village, including phased land transfers to the Nation. Seaspan Ferries Relationship Protocol Agreement and Impact Benefit Agreement to guide ongoing collaboration at spe'ulhxun (Duke Point). Transportation Investment Corporation Participating Nation agreement, in recognition of Snuneymuxw treaty rights and regarding of Highway 99 Fraser River Tunnel Project. Vancouver Fraser Port Authority Participating Nation agreement, in recognition of Snuneymuxw treaty rights and regarding Tilbury Marine Jetty. Canada Interim Land Reconciliation Agreement, ~80 hectares of land returned to Snuneymuxw as Addition to Reserve land. Purchase sxwayxum (1 Terminal Avenue, Nanaimo) and announce sale agreements with Casino Nanaimo and Elements Victoria Acquisition of Casino Nanaimo and Elements Victoria completes, te'tuxwtun project kicks off ~80 hectares of te'tuxwtun lands are designated as Reserve lands.

Our territory spans eastern Vancouver Island, the Gulf Islands and parts of the Fraser River.

The language of Snuneymuxw is Snuneymuxw hul'q'umi'num', a living language that expresses our worldview and way of life. Our language connects us to the wisdom and knowledge of our ancestors.

Chief Michael Wyse, Xumtilum, is the son of Joe Wyse and the late Chief Viola Wyse. He has served as Snuneymuxw's Chief since 2018. In his time as Chief, he has overseen:

- Municipal, provincial and federal agreements
- Partnerships, including: Nanaimo Port Authority, Hullo ferries, Seacliff Properties, Seaspan Ferries
- The acquisition of: Casino Nanaimo, Elements Victoria, sxwayxum lands (1 Terminal Ave).
- The construction and opening of Marriott Nanaimo, Coast Salish Canna and other SFN-owned businesses.
- The construction and opening of an on-reserve elementary school, youth centre and second SFN daycare.
- The securing of 72+ new on-reserve affordable homes, along with off-reserve supportive and transitional housing.
