

RIVER ROCK & MAPLE RIDGE CASINO ACQUISITIONS





PDG has entered into agreements to purchase River Rock Casino Resort and Chances Maple Ridge from Great Canadian Entertainment.

With these acquisitions, building on the recent purchases of Casino Nanaimo and Elements Casino Victoria, PDG will become one of B.C.'s largest casino operators by revenue and the largest Indigenous owned gaming operator by revenue in Canada.

These milestones mark a major step toward Snuneymuxw's economic selfdetermination, creating lasting prosperity for our Nation and communities across the province.

The Ministerial Order recognizes our shared truth and honours generations of Snuneymuxw leadership who upheld our rights and title. The development of these lands will have a significant and lasting impact on the regional economy.

Land Guardian Program Announcement

The Lands and Natural Resources department is happy to announce the establishment of the new Land Guardian Program. Overseen by the Lands Division, the Land Guardian Program recently hired its first 2 members who you may recognize from the community, Robert White (Phillips) and Edward Wyse-Good Jr. two young individuals who are equally eager and excited to represent the community and contribute to land stewardship. Both Robert and Edward have grown up hunting and exploring the lands, their experiences and knowledge of the traditional territory will be an immense asset to the Land Guardian Program.

The new Land Guardian Program aims to strengthen natural resource management by gathering and collecting information in order to better understand the current status of the land-based ecosystems of the Snuneymuxw traditional territory. The Land Guardian Program is rooted in preserving, protecting, and promoting the Snuneymuxw culture, values and way of life, an objective of the 2024-2028 Snuneymuxw Strategic Plan.

In addition to creating a visual presence throughout the traditional territory, the Land Guardians will be responsible for taking on various small scale restoration projects, monitoring wildlife populations, educating users on best practices and back country safety and eventually leading community and youth programs to promote the transferring of knowledge amongst the community and strengthening the connection between the people and the land.

Notice of Chief & Councillor Nomination Meeting

A meeting of the electors of the Snuneymuxw First Nation will be held to nominate candidates for one (1) Chief and five (5) councillors for the next four-year term, commencing February 2, 2026. The term is expiring for Chief and 5 Councillors. The following councillors will continue in their positions until February 1, 2028: Councillors Eli Wyse, Kate Good, Regan Seward, Isaac Thomas and Bill Yoachim.

You must be a Snuneymuxw member and 18 years or older as of December 13, 2025 to nominate, be a candidate, or vote. You may nominate or second up to 1 candidate for Chief and up to 5 for Councillor.

- ☐ Candidates must be ordinarily resident within the SFN Candidacy Area.
- ☐ You may nominate in person at the meeting. You may also deliver nomination forms to the Electoral Officer (I encourage you to email forms back to: ronlauferelections@gmail.com). Mail-in nominations (including those that are hand-delivered) must include the signed and witnessed Voter Declaration Form. You may copy a blank nomination form if you wish to nominate for multiple positions.
- ☐ Mail-in nomination forms must be received by the electoral officer by 4:30 PM on November 7, 2025. Hand-delivered nomination forms must be received by the Electoral Officer before the close of the nomination meeting at 9:00 p.m. in order to be valid.

Any elector may vote in person, online or by mail-in ballot (Canada Post may not be available).

NOMINEE REQUIRMENTS:

- Nominees with a criminal conviction within the past five (5) years are not eligible to hold office.
- If you are nominated on November 7, you will have three (3) days until 4:30 p.m. on November 10, 2025 to submit a recent Criminal Record Check, Candidacy Acceptance Form and Declaration of Eligibility Form to the Electoral Officer. Nominees who fail to meet this deadline cannot be a candidate in the election. Copies of the SFN Electoral Code are available at the SFN Administration Office. Candidacy Acceptance Forms are available from the Electoral Officer.

THLAP'QWUM COMMUNITY SETTLEMENT TRUST Notice of Nomination Meeting

DATE: November 7, 2025 TIME: 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM

LOCATION: Snuneymuxw Gymnasium (1145 Totem Road, Nanaimo, BC)

A meeting of the electors of the Snuneymuxw First Nation will be held at the above time and place to nominate candidates for the position of Community Trustee of the Thlap'Qwum Community Settlement Trust (the "Trust"). Two (2) Trustees will be elected, one (1) resident Trustee and one (1) non-resident Trustee. The four-year term of office for the Trustees will begin on February 2, 2026.

- Nominees must submit a candidate acceptance form and criminal record check by November 10th at 4:30 PM and be approved by the Administrative Trustee to stand for election.
- Potential candidates must satisfy all the eligibility requirements to serve as a Trustee:
 - 1. be at least 19 years of age;
 - 2. not be mentally incompetent;
 - 3. not be bankrupt or have been convicted of fraud;
 - 4. have financial, legal, accounting, or business education or experience;
 - 5. be a SFN member;
 - not be a member of SFN Council, an employee of SFN, nor an employee, director, or
 officer of any organization owned or controlled by SFN, except for positions of
 administrative assistance to SFN Council or the Trust; and
 - have no prior convictions for indictable offences for which a pardon was not obtained, as evidenced by a criminal record check.

You must be a registered Snuneymuxw member and at least 18 years of age as of December 13, 2025 (election day) to nominate a candidate or vote.

You may nominate in person at the meeting. You may also deliver nomination forms to the Electoral Officer (I encourage you to email forms back to: ronlauferelections@gmail.com). Mail-in nominations (including those that are hand-delivered) must include the signed and witnessed Voter Declaration Form. You may copy a blank nomination form if you wish to nominate for both positions. Please note you can only nominate one person for each position (resident and non-resident Trustee). Each form must be signed by you and witnessed.

Mail-in nomination forms must be received by the electoral officer by 4:30 PM on November 7, 2025. Hand-delivered nomination forms must be received by the Electoral Officer before the close of the nomination meeting at 9:00 p.m. in order to be valid.

Notice is hereby given to the electors of the Snuneymuxw First Nation that a poll will be held to elect five (5) Councillors for a term of four (4) years. As Michael James Wyse was the only candidate duly nominated for Chief and having submitted the required documents to accept the nomination, Chief Wyse is acclaimed for another term and no election will take place for the position of Chief. At the same time, an election is being held to elect two (2) Community Trustees of the Thlap'Qwum Community Settlement Trust (one (1) resident Trustee and one (1) non-resident Trustee).

 - b) Whether detox support is needed before starting treatment.



- c) Review treatment options including treatment centres.
- d) The support we can provide while you wait for additional help.
- 4. Plan for ongoing and post treatment support.

Our counsellors at SFN hulit lelum have completed trauma-informed, master's level university education and are certified counsellors.

Our counsellors are available Monday to Friday to support Snuneymuxw members.

Some of the areas that our counsellors may be able to help with include, but are not limited to:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- · Grief & Loss
- Loss of relationships (friends, partners)
- · Coping with anger
- · Dealing with difficult emotions
- · Coping skills / emotional regulation
- · Self-esteem / self-worth
- Communication
- · Creating healthy boundaries
- · Coping with racism and discrimination
- Coping with impact of residential school and day school
- Concerns about your own, or someone else's substance use

If our counsellors determine that you may be better supported by another service provider (for example, someone who specializes in a particular area) they can help you navigate other options.


GARBAGE PICK UP: MONDAY & THURSDAY
